Aim, data, evaluation and result







For the first time, the Financial Times and Statista have identified the best employers in Europe

Key points of the ranking

Relevance of the ranking

Skill shortages are increasingly becoming a significant issue for employers across Europe, as highlighted by a European Council report⁽¹⁾. This trend is driven by demographic changes, the demand for new skillsets, and poor working conditions in certain sectors. Three out of four employers in 21 European countries reported difficulty in finding the skills they need. This was 42% in 2018, reflecting a 79% increase over the past five years (33 percentage points) in 2024⁽²⁾. As a result, it is becoming even more important for companies to differentiate themselves in order to be attractive to potential employees and retain existing ones.

Ranking's cornerstones

Summary

Europe's Best Employers are identified in an independent survey from a vast sample of European employees working for companies employing at least 500 people within Europe⁽¹⁾.

The survey was conducted using **open survey on ft.com** and **several online access panels**, providing a representative samples of the workforce employed by large organizations in each country. The employees have not been consulted via their employers but **anonymously** through several online panels. By doing so, the employee could openly state their opinion, avoiding any influence from their employer. Each respondent was asked which firm or institution he or she works for in an open-ended question and with an autofill option. The survey was conducted based around companies **from all sectors** with more than 500 employees in Europe. In total, the survey took an average of 8-10 minutes to complete. Over **4,000,000 employer evaluations** were considered.

The final score is based on two types of evaluations: **personal recommendation** (the willingness of employees to recommend their employer) and **public recommendation** (the willingness of employees to recommend other employers from the industry in which they are currently employed), with a higher weighting for direct recommendation.

The 1,000 companies receiving the highest total scores are awarded as "Europe's Best Employers 2025."



Europe's Best Employers follows the same approach as other employers' projects

Data-based results



The Survey is programmed and responses are gathered. Incoming data is cleaned and prepared for analysis

Organizations are researched to verify that they fit the project's scope. Data is gathered via **publicly** available company information









Analysis

The prepared data is analyzed with a proven scoring model to create a ranking of the **highest rated** employer brands. Further evaluation is made on demographic and industry levels to gather insights into the european labor market

The final ranking is published by Financial Times which shows the top 1000 Europe's **Best Employers**




¹⁾ Online access panel is a representative sample of people from the population, primarily used for consumer research. Panelists register online and are invited to participate in surveys for which they qualify based on their sociodemographic information.

⁽²⁾ The survey remains open and accessible year-round, enabling participants to engage at any time throughout the year.
